Mark Brooks - RIP 23.12.24



Many of you will have known, or been aware of my dad because of the huge sunflowers that he grew in his front garden on Blanshards Lane, of which he was hugely proud, happily standing to have his photo taken to show just how tall they actually were!

His life began 90 years ago in Newcastle upon Tyne and his geordie twang was still with him right until the end. He did his National Service in Germany and then met my mum, Yvonne, at a local dance, and were soon married. They danced together all of their lives, always making sure that any holiday destination included a dance floor.

As a young couple they moved south where Dad joined the Ministry of Agriculture. The MAFF moved him around the country on a regular basis, and he acquired 2 children along the way, my brother Paul and I. During these travels he came upon North Cave and decided it was the place to settle once retirement loomed. And so they settled into village life in 1979, and it was only in August of last year that they made their final move into Orchard Court in South Cave, when they could no longer manage at home.

In the intervening years my parents lived a busy and happy life, and their expanding family grew to include 3 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren. They joined the Caravan Club and were regularly to be seen blocking the lane as they manoeuvred their caravan on and off the drive! Dad was very proud of the work he helped with in the village. Joining the fight against the tip, which was so successful that the resulting Wetlands are now known far and wide. He also became a member of the parish council and helped with Village Link deliveries, though his 'link' to that publication is probably better known through the articles he wrote especially the April Fools that he came up with that had people scratching their heads and wondering if they were true. And in 2023 when there was a special article celebrating my parents 65th wedding anniversary, along with a letter from the newly crowned King Charles.

When Dad's eyesight failed and the car and the caravan had to go my parents took to other forms of transport and still



travelled extensively far and near until his ill health with Parkinsons Disease, and hers with dementia, kept them ever closer to home.

Dad died peacefully, after a long and happy life, at Hull Royal Infirmary on 23rd December, 2024. He will be sorely missed.

What does the NCPC do to try and alleviate some of the Village's traffic issues?

Well considering it is ERYC who have most of the statutory and political power and the money we give it a good try... by negotiating, lobbying and pestering on behalf of the village and with a STRATEGY and DAY by DAY actions eg....

- We, and especially Cllr Gibson-Matthews with help from Liz and Bill at 2B Landscape Consultancy spent a lot of time and effort last year putting together a strong, well thought out and detailed proposal to ERYC for a 20mph limit throughout the village. Eventually we were turned down...but we are still trying...
- Data gathering with the Telraam device, (Thanks to the gentleman in Church Street who has one, and who drew our attention to its potential). Having our own to measure the flow and speed of traffic in various locations, will allow us to put the village's needs forward, based on objective hard facts and not just opinion.
- The establishment of a Community Speed Watch. Volunteers will be needed, not just welcome. The scheme has the power to affect driving behaviour, via letters of warning from Humberside Police, based on evidence from the speed camera devices.
- 4. Our planned action to convince ERYC to amend the speed limits along Newport Road and the reasons we have amassed in support.
- 5. Our planned action to prohibit towed caravans from coming through the village except for access and to monitor that prohibition with Community Speed Watch and SNAP.
- Our planned action to try and persuade ERYC to put in pedestrian refuges in the busy parts of the road through the village, especially where the young and the old need to cross.
- 7. Videoing traffic violations especially by large lorries and reporting the drivers to their employers and the police via SNAP.
- 8. Making sure that any traffic-affected works carried out by ERYC or its contractors are

properly planned and with adequate notice and signage. KCOM, BT & Quickline have all been recently working in the village.

- Helping bus traffic passengers by repairing the Bus Shelter in Station Road; trying to get a reduction in the speed limit along Newport Road and a road refuge for school children using the Newport Road bus stops who have to cross the road to get home.
- Going through a careful recruitment process, employing Roy, our village streets, pavements and paths litter champion, keeping thoroughfares clear of debris and safer to use.
- 11. Repair and improve signage around the village, making sure they are clean and not obstructed by foliage etc.
- 12. Continually lobbying for Tarmac repairs and improvements; Blanshards Lane and the top of Church Street being the latest and, hopefully, successful representations for re-surfacing of Newport Road this year.
- 13. Doing what we can to change the Google algorithm which usually shows the route through North Cave when, in our view, the A1034 through South Cave would better suit traffic and is without the weight limitations.
- 14. The village businesses, the most impactful of which is the quarry on both sides of Newport Road. Keeping regular contact with Breedons and working together to keep Newport Road free of debris and flowing; despite the heavy and dirty trucks coming along, turning and crossing the road numerous times each day.
- 15. A constant check has to be kept on the state of the highways, their drainage and fitness for purpose. The village is also dissected with lanes, paths and bridges, which take substantial pedestrian traffic. Keeping them open and as free of mud, in the winter, and overgrown hedges, in the summer, and the bridges safe.
- 16. We can't do nearly all that we want; but as volunteers, we do our best.
