
We joined North Cave Summer Gala and held a 'Teddy Tombola'- thanks to all who supported us despite the rain!

New Look War Memorial

Sharp-eyed passers-by will have seen that the War Memorial now has an outer coat of scaffolding and might be wondering what is happening. This is to let you know that sometime within the next few weeks the Memorial will be cleaned to return it to its original state and how it was last seen after it was cleaned in 2016. This is the first stage of an uplift for the War Memorial and its surrounds. Once cleaned, Stage 2 will be to start work on the paving immediately around the structure.



The Memorial and its surround, has been the focus of concern by the Parish Council for a number of years and many options have been explored. We looked into the option to replace the area with a bespoke Yorkstone

surface, using stone from a West Yorkshire Quarry. This would have been expensive and involved a fair amount of digging and disruption around the base of the Memorial. The final solution, that has been agreed, is a two colour Flexistone base, laid over a flexible sub-base, which will not require as much digging to create a foundation. The new Flexistone surface will form a solid, but permeable, surface. It will be flexible enough to allow tree roots to move underneath, without causing any problems with the surface. Being permeable, any rain falling onto the surface will drain through and not create any puddles and minimise slip hazards, as well as allowing air to transfer through the surface to any roots underneath. It will avoid any issues associated with joints breaking up and is expected to last for many years to come.

The next job for the Parish Council is to seek approval to the design from East Riding of Yorkshire Council and the War Memorial Trust. Assuming we get the go-ahead, we are hopeful that the new surface will be in place prior to Remembrance Day in November.

The Parish Council hopes that you will all like the end result.

Community Speed Watch

North Cave Parish Council is pleased to announce the launch of the Community Speed Watch (CSW), CSW relies on volunteers to monitor and record speeding vehicles in their local areas, aiming to educate drivers and improve road safety for all.



The scheme involves trained volunteers from both the Parish council and residents, currently including: Cllr Gibson-Matthews who's is the coordinator for the North Cave group, Cllr North, Cllr Godfrev, and Cllr Tullock.

Resident volunteers include: Mr Embleton, Mr Ball, Mr Cox and Mr Mudryk.

Without these volunteers the scheme would not be the success it is proving to be.

CSW is a police supported initiative in which volunteers monitor and record speeding vehicles in our community.

Hedgehogs in need of help:

LETHARGIC Hedgehogs don't sunbathel **OBVIOUSLY**

INJURED

FLIES If there are flies around a hedgehog it needs help

WOBBLY If hedgehogs are wobbling as they walk there is something wrong.

TRAPPED

HOGLETS

If seen out in the day withou an adult and/or squawking

OUT DURING THE DAY

Some exceptions being a mum nest building or taking a break from the nest or any adult that has been disturbed and is seeking safety. These hedgehogs will be healthy looking and walking with purpose:

If you see hedgehogs in need of help, please carry out the following first aid:

+ Use gardening gloves or a folded towel to gently pick the hedgehog up and pop it into a high sided cardboard or plastic box

+ Bring the box indoors away from flies.

+ Keep the hedgehog in a quiet room away from pets and children and don't be tempted to look at it any more often than you must to carry out first aid.

 Unless it's a very hot day, wrap a warm hot water bottle in a towel and place the hedgehog on it, with another towel gently draped over the hedgehog to keep the warmth in, make sure it has room to get off the bottle and that it stays warm (but not hot) at all times

+ Offer a small amount of hedgehog food or meaty cat or dog food and some water - don't force feed

+ If it is a small hedgehog or hoglet do check nearby for others from the same litter that might also be in trouble

+ Call the British Hedgehog Preservation Society on 01584 890 801 for the phone number of your local independent hedgehog rescue volunteers (or go direct to the rescue if you have contact details)

The first North Cave community speed watch took place on the 13th of June at a designated location on Newport Road.

The number of vehicles that passed during the hour speed watch were 354, with no recorded speeding. Drivers adhered to the 30mph speed zone and some even gave the thumbs up to the CSW group, a very positive result.

Dan Goodman, Humberside Police Community Speed Watch Co-ordinator, said:

"It has been a pleasure to assist the North Cave CSW Team to get up and running and to witness their first live operation. There is a sense of genuine keenness and enthusiasm for the scheme and the potential it has for educating drivers recorded as exceeding the speed limit through the village".

Twice a month North Cave CSW group aim to be out at various designated locations within North Cave village.

The aims of the CSW are to educate drivers and change their behaviour regarding speed, and to reduce speeding within the North Cave community. It also helps to improve road safety and reduce the risk of accidents and casualties.

EIGHT ACRE LAKE - MIRES LANE, NORTH CAVE



Wild swimming at Eight Acre Lake - a serene waterscape nestled just off the A63 near North Cave, East Yorkshire. The lake offers a captivating escape into open-water immersion. Once a gravel pit, the lake now stretches across eight acres and plunges to around 14 m at its deepest, making it a vibrant playground for both swimmers and divers.

Calm and accessible, the lake features gentle sloping entries and deep-water spots braced by rails—ideal for every level of brave soul.

A café, warm changing rooms, lockers, toilets, and onsite equipment rental craft a welcoming, community-rich vibe.

Beneath the surface, you'll glide past perch, trout, sturgeon, carp, and even golden rudd. Divers play among submerged relics—a Piper helicopter, boats, pipes, platforms—while swimmers hug the perimeter to avoid bubbles from diving tanks.

Those crisp, cool temperatures demand a neoprene embrace and/or a visibility-boosting buoy.

Booking is essential. You can swim in a normal swimsuit during the summer, but always using a visible tow float

Stepping off the gravel into fresh water, the first chill tingles your senses—sharp.



invigorating, alive. As you swim the bank's gentle arc, sunlight dances on the surface, filtered through clear visibility of up to 10 m beneath you. It is a silent ballet of divers, and

fellow swimmers. all coexisting in this unexpected freshwater haven. Back onshore, the café buzzes with warmth and camaraderie. Friendly chats about recent dives, swap wetsuit tips, sip steaming hot chocolate, and tuck into a bacon sandwich while musing on that midnight dive glow you just left behind.



Eight Acre Lake strikes a perfect balance: crisp Yorkshire fresh water and an inviting communal spirit. Whether you're a curious beginner or a seasoned open-water enthusiast, this eight-acre expanse offers a refreshing plunge and a warm welcome.

Everthorpe Lane - Sustainable Farming



Dear Editor

I am aware that some people are curious to understand what is being 'grown' in the fields off Everthorpe Lane.

You may have seen in the media that the previous area-based payment to farmers, the Basic Payment Scheme (BPS), has been phased out. Effectively the money is now redirected to farmers who support environmentally sustainable practices on their land. This is known as the Sustainable Farming Incentive (SFI). There are lots of options within the scheme and agreements are short term.

While I have for the last 25 years had parts of our farm entered into Environmental schemes of one sort of another, we now have a larger area included. One block of land is off Everthorpe Lane. Under the new SFI scheme, the aim is to help wildlife like beetles, spiders, small mammals, birds, and beneficial insects thrive. The typical light land plants / flowers also get an opportunity to thrive and you may have noticed the poppies have certainly benefited!



So, what is the purpose of the SFI scheme? Essentially it pays farmers to maintain and improve soil health, provide better habitats for wildlife, reduce nutrient run off, reduce watercourse pollution, and to manage hedgerow and grassland sustainably. Many farmers do this already and very successfully, but the scheme helps farmers take that extra step - should they choose to.

On the flip side, land entered into SFI is taken out of food production - at a time when global demand continues to rise. This may well lead to imports from other countries with lower food production standards, therefore undermining UK food security. SFI is also seen as only paying for new actions and not for ongoing good farming practice and management.

Every farming business will be working out the pros and cons and whether to join or not to join. And to what extent. This will depend on several factors such as land type, current fixed costs, tenancy agreements and whether it simply feels right or not. Farmers want to farm. They want to produce food, care for the land and run a viable business. The SFI can feel at odds with that instinct, especially when some options are framed as getting paid *not* to farm.

SFI is seen by many as a tool, not the future. The challenge is finding a balance between food production and looking after nature & the environment. But what is fundamentally important is that UK farmers are supported to do what they do best – produce high quality food.

We need to encourage consumers, retailers and governments to prioritise British grown food over imports and pay a fair price that supports the cost of production. In the meantime, supermarkets continue to exert significant control over the price of our food

which means this does not always happen.

But hang on, I wonder if they want to buy my poppy seeds?... now that could be a happy ending.
