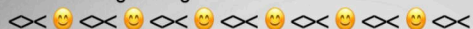

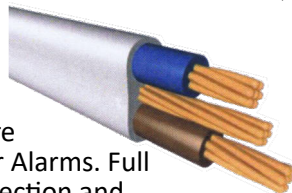

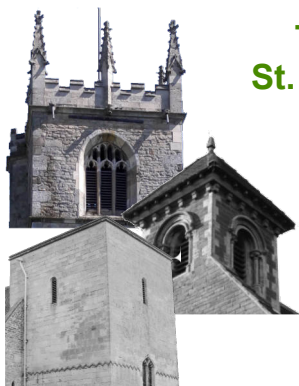

All Saints, North Cave Bell Ringers

On the 9th October we took twenty-six ringers, friends, villagers and financial partners down to John Taylors Bell Foundry in Loughborough to see our two new bells being cast. After four years of planning, we had finally got to the 'bricks and sticks' of our augmentation to eight bells. It is lovely to think that our two new bells had been cast in the very same foundry hall, at the historic Taylors Bell Foundry, 106 years and 8 days after the casting of our original six.



As I write, we are now waiting on our new additions to be collected from Loughborough and taken to Oxford, where they will be tuned. The work is due to start at the church around the second week of January 2026. The first phase will be to temporarily move our existing heaviest bell, so that the new sub-frame steelwork can be lifted the 50ft into the belfry. Then there will be a bit of time so that we can get the steelwork back-filled into the tower structure and the engineering pad stones fitted.

At the first visit from our bell hangers, Whites of Appleton, our new bells will be on the ground floor of the church, so our plan is to make a display of them, so that locals can see them, before they are hoisted up and hung - for at least another hundred years, or so.

The installation work means that we will not be ringing at All Saints for about five weeks. This also means that the church clock will be out of action for the same period of time, as the drive arms to the clock face have to be removed.

When I finally get confirmation of all the

important dates I shall put something on the Community Facebook page, just in case anyone would like to witness the new steelwork and bells being hoisted up through all of the tower floors. I was also wondering if this is something that the School would like to get involved with? So, if there is anyone who may be able to help set this up out there please let me know.

We would like to thank all who have made donations and supported this project so far, we are still a little bit short, so if anyone would like to donate, please do contact me.

On the ringing side of things, we have continued with our most important job, that of supporting the church for services, Remembrance, weddings, special occasions, concerts and funerals, when asked to do so.

In April we had our Spring Tour. This year we went down for the weekend, ringing at churches, around Lincoln. On the Saturday afternoon we had the twelve bells at Lincoln Cathedral all to ourselves. I reminded our ringers, before we started at the Cathedral, of the importance of where we were ringing - a national land mark with the surrounding streets and spaces full of tourists enjoying the beautiful weather that we were blessed with. I wasted my breath, as our ringing was absolutely stunning on the twelve bells.

Training has been a major part of our work this year, not just for our own development but that of other churches too. Jane and Marcia started with us, from scratch, this year and both are now well up to Sunday Service ringing standards. Through the arm of our school, The East Riding School of Bell Ringing, we have also been teaching new recruits from Kirk Ella, Ferriby, Holme on Spalding Moor and Bubwith.

Early October was the time for our annual 'fly away' ringing tour, but this time we sailed, to Holland, staying in Dordrecht for four nights and ringing at the new and marvellous ten bells at Grote Kerk and the eight bells at 't Klokhuis. I have to say that the hospitality we received from the local ringers was second to none. We also managed to ring three quarter-

peals while we were there, with one of them being a nice landmark for both Carolyn and myself, as it has meant that we have both rung a quarter-peal at every tower in mainland Europe that supports the English style of full circle change ringing.

I would like to take this opportunity to again thank everyone for their support and the lovely comments I receive from people, while just being around the village. It is very special to



us, thank you. Of course, we would also like to say thank you to Vicar Barry, the church wardens and the church PCC for their continued support.

Little Moor Drain runs from the east of Station Road, under the School and through The Croft. The culvert at the top of Finkle Street had become blocked, adding to flooding of Finkle Street, Westgate and Blanshards Lane. Residents of Finkle Street will be aware that that the ERYC Flood Risk team completed their work, in the last month or so, to provide a better link, from The Croft, to a relief drain originally installed by Yorkshire Water after the 2007 floods. Hopefully, the inconvenience of the works will be worthwhile and should result in less flooding in this area.

Everthorpe Lane

We spoke to ERYC Flood Risk earlier this year about carrying out similar works on Everthorpe Lane in North Cave, to that which they did to the east of Everthorpe village in the spring. The aim would be to stop the road being a pathway for floodwater from the fields, like it was in 2019-20, by digging better ditches to each side of the road, whilst also incorporating leaky barriers, to help slow the flow. Watch this space!

Fishponds and Drewton Beck

WWSTF has been discussing measures with the Carver estate, and is proposing to carry out more Natural Flood Management (NFM) works upstream of North Cave, along Drewton Beck. These should complement further NFM works being carried out by the ERYC Flood Risk team on the ERYC Estate which also borders the Beck. As Drewton Beck carries 25% of the river water that enters North Cave,

this can only help to reduce flooding peaks.

Meanwhile, we have also agreed to carry out habitat restoration at the Fishponds, a designated Local Wildlife Site west of Blossoms Lane and just north of the Beck. This will involve restoring open water to the centre of the fishponds. They are designated for having nutrient-rich standing water surrounded by semi-natural neutral grassland, but have become infilled over many years.

Ellerker

Covering all the chalk streams along the western edge of the Wolds, we are also working with a landowner at Woodale, above Ellerker, to incorporate NFM features into his exciting rewinding site.

Watery Plump, South Cave

Following discussions with WWSTF, in recent years, the ERYC Flood Risk Team has created substantial NFM measures at 'Watery Plump' another Local Wildlife Site, at the back of West End, South Cave. This site lies along Ferry Beck, which is not a chalk stream, but is 'winterbourne', which means that it flows during wetter winter weather. It has flooded West End in the past

The works include inlets from ferry beck into the wildlife site, with new winding channels and a pond being dug. These are called 'offline storage' and will allow rising beck water to flood into the site, thus managing the water levels and reducing the likelihood of flooding at West End. They also increase the range of wetland habitats and enhance biodiversity. Great job by ERYC Flood Risk Team!

WAR MEMORIAL - REFRESHED

You probably noticed that the War Memorial was a hive of activity at the end of October. This was the end result of a lot of time and effort on the part of the Parish Council, to decide the best approach for the long-term care and maintenance of the Memorial, and the health and safety issues of the old crazy-paving surround.

Having discussed a range of options, the final decision was to remove the existing crazy paving, which had seriously deteriorated in recent years. It was replaced with Flexistone, which is a porous, flexible resin-bound stone surface, that allows for movement of tree roots without cracking.

As part of the project, it was agreed that, working on a top-down principle, it was time to clean the Memorial before any ground work was carried out. The cleaning highlighted the fact that the worst area of staining was around the bottom layer of the base, where it was directly in contact with the old stone surface. During heavy rainfall, water and dirt used to splash back up against the sides of the Memorial. This created the perfect damp conditions for algae and lichen to take hold and spread. When cleaning, it was not possible to remove all the staining from these growths without damaging the Grade 2 Listed Monument. However, the new surface, being porous, allows water to seep directly through it and limits any splash back. This should reduce future algal growth and help with the long-term care of the Memorial.

Before doing any work, the Parish Council consulted East Riding Heritage Officers and the War Memorial Trust. East Riding, as the local heritage custodians, had no objection.

The following photos show the changes from March 2008 to November 2025. In 2008 the Parish Council removed the remains of the old concrete block seats, replaced the steps with stone and added the cast-iron and hardwood seats. In 2016 the Memorial was cleaned.

As part of the clean up this year, the slats of the seats were removed, thoroughly cleaned, refreshed, and replaced.

As we reported in the last edition, and as can be seen if you visit, the Play Area is fast reaching its use-by date. The much-loved Zip-Line doesn't hold much weight these days and various items have had to be removed, or are close to needing to be removed.

The Playing Field Committee sub-group has been working hard to fill in application forms for different funding pots in an attempt to raise enough before the two main suppliers of equipment (Kompan and Playdale) are forced to put their prices up. We have, also, written to local businesses but, to date, have not heard back.

Price Rises and Funding

If we could confirm more funding by the start of December, the play equipment suppliers had said that they would be able to hold their prices for us. Unfortunately, we are not able to do that. Sadly, we were unsuccessful in a recent funding bid and narrowly missed the submission date for another large funding bid, due to the lack of any substantial third party company commitment. Now, we have to wait until January before we can start that large fund application process again. Also, with the threatened price increase, we are going to have to wait to see how much more we will need to raise. At the time of writing, we don't

know by how much. It is all a bit disappointing but we will soldier on.

We are, however, very grateful for all the support that has already been shown and the funding that we have received, particularly on the LocalGiving site and as a result of support for the various events organised throughout the year. We were pleased to have just received a £320 donation from the recent Harvest Festival event - held, for the first time, at the Club.

Local Support

As we have told you before, funding bodies increasingly ask that we show that we have other sources of funding to cover at least 10% of what they are giving to us. Most importantly, we need to show that we have a strong level of community support. We have been to talk to Mr Winks, Head of North Cave Primary School, about how the School can help us. We will be working with him and the children in the coming weeks. We have also been in conversation with East Riding County Council, through Cllr Victoria Aitken. We hope that the Parish Council might be able to assist with future funding possibilities.

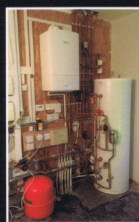
