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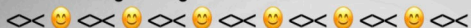
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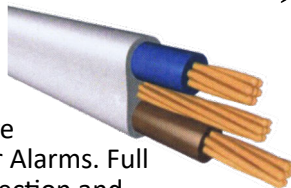

Local Police Presence

Community Speed Watch Update

Four Community Speed Watch (CSW) sessions were conducted during June. The team of volunteers, supported by Parish Councillors, aims to carry out four to five CSW sessions each month. One additional session had been scheduled but was cancelled on the morning due to poor weather conditions and reduced visibility.

A total of **822 vehicles** were monitored across

all sessions:

- **229 vehicles** at Site CES 0317 – Newport Road (40mph)
- **233 vehicles** at Site CES 0325 – Westgate (30mph, dual-direction monitoring)
- **143 vehicles** at Site CES 0324 – Station Road 20mph, monitoring)
- **217 vehicles** at Site CES 0317 – Newport Road (40mph)

Of the vehicles recorded:

- One vehicle exceeded the 30mph speed limit, travelling at 38mph.
- One driver was reported for abusive behaviour towards volunteers.
- Four vehicles exceeded the 20mph advisory limit outside the school.

Community Speed Watch with North Cave Primary School

On Friday 22 May, Community Speed Watch, volunteer councillors North and Vice Chair Gibson-Matthews, joined Humberside Police PCSOs, the Headteacher and pupils from North Cave Primary School for a special Community Speed Watch session outside the school.

As part of the activity, pupils were given the opportunity to participate in the Community Speed Watch initiative using the radar gun. They learned how vehicle information is recorded on monitoring sheets and gained an understanding of the important role CSW plays in helping to keep the village safe by raising drivers' awareness of local speed restrictions.

The event formed part of the Humberside Police Mini Police programme. Each participant received a high-visibility vest and baseball cap. The Mini Police project is a fun and interactive initiative for children aged 9 to 11, delivered in schools with the support of local Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs).

The two PCSOs supervised groups of five pupils, alongside Cllr North and Vice Chair Gibson-Matthews, during the speed monitoring exercise. The pupils showed great enthusiasm and were keen to learn more about road safety and community policing.

National Community Speed Watch Day 15th July

Community Speed Watch (CSW) Day is an annual awareness and action campaign that highlights the important contribution volunteers make in promoting road safety within their



communities. Humberside Police regularly support and participate in this initiative, working alongside trained Community

Speed Watch volunteers and roads policing officers to monitor vehicle speeds and raise awareness of the dangers associated with speeding.

The campaign provides an opportunity to engage with motorists, encourage compliance with speed limits and reinforce the message that excessive speed puts all road users at risk. Through education and community involvement, National Community Speed Watch Day helps promote safer driving habits and supports ongoing efforts to improve road safety across local communities.

Thank You for Supporting Our Summer Fair

We'd like to say a huge thank you to everyone who supported our Summer Fair in June.

Despite the unpredictable weather, we welcomed a fantastic turnout. Thanks to the incredible support of our visitors, volunteers, donors, staff, service users and local businesses, the event raised an amazing **£6,768.05** for the charity – our biggest Summer Fair total yet.

Mires Beck Gardening Tips

Perennials

Continue deadheading flowering plants to encourage fresh blooms. Divide overcrowded perennials towards the end of the season and keep newly planted specimens well watered.

Herbs

Harvest regularly while growth remains strong. Dry or freeze surplus herbs for use throughout winter and remove any flowers if you want to prolong leaf production.

Wildflowers

Allow seed heads to develop where possible to support wildlife and encourage natural self-seeding. Avoid cutting back too early and enjoy the late-season pollinators they attract.

Our peat-free perennials, herbs, wildflowers and trees are carefully nurtured by our service users, helping them learn new skills, build confidence and be part of a supportive community. Every plant purchase supports the charity and helps us continue providing meaningful opportunities and a place where people can grow, just like the plants they care for.

Biodiversity Action Plan

The Parish Council adopted a Biodiversity Action Plan (BAP) on 16 June, to take forward its Biodiversity Policy (BP), which was adopted last year. There is now an informal Biodiversity Group (BG) of 3 parish councillors (Julie Steels, Steve Thackeray and Howard Strong) with Bill and Elizabeth Blackledge providing technical support. We are keen to involve more people, of all abilities and interests, to help push this agenda forward. Get in touch (via NCPC or Village Link) if you are interested in knowing more.

NCPC hopes to create a biodiversity page on the PC website to host the updated BP and BAP and explain what the PC is doing, who it is working with and how to get involved.

We are planning a parish biodiversity meeting, with expert and experienced speakers coming together with locals, to explore and agree the best actions we can carry out, to benefit wildlife across and beyond the parish. The aim is to run the meeting this October - watch this space and local media for the next announcement.

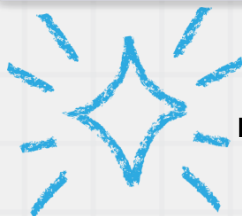


Family Building Day

North Cave Coal Exporters Cricket Club

It has been a challenging season for the Coalies 1st XI, but there have still been flashes of quality and

plenty of individual moments to build on.

Batting has generally been the main struggle, with heavy defeats against Malton, Goole and Clifton, plus a low total of 86 in mid-June.

However, there were signs of improvement against Pickering, where Ted Burrell and James Forrester put on the side's biggest partnership of the season, helping the team to 187. Ted has been a consistent bright spot with the bat, while Jaison Mathew, James Barker and James Forrester also showed attacking intent at Goole. With the ball, Ethan Steel has continued to consistently pick up wickets, while opening bowler Liam Walker reached the superb milestone of 600 wickets for the club, and James Rounding helped mop up Clifton's tail, as the 1st XI bowled a side out for the first time this season. Though still without a win in the hugely competitive Championship Central, the team's performances are trending in a positive direction – fingers crossed they can put more points on the board by season end in September!

The 2nd XI have enjoyed a more productive spell, picking up two strong wins despite losing time to the weather. Their victory over Driffield was built on a real team batting effort, with Cody Reed top scoring and Raj Roy, Sam Young, James Morris, Dave Whalen and Aabid Bashir all making useful 20s before the bowlers took control. Andy Reeves claimed 4-

14, Raj Roy delivered a miserly 2-8, and Jordan Mitchell struck early to set up the win. A week later, they backed it up with an 89-run victory over Pelican. Dan Kemp's composed unbeaten 70 anchored the innings, Shaun Johnson Jr added power, and the lower order helped push the total to 229/8. James Smith and Raj Roy then did the damage with the ball, supported by tidy spells from Andy Reeves and Dinesh Sriram. Two further fixtures were affected by rain or abandonment, but overall the 2nd XI are in good shape to push towards the top half of the table as the season goes on.

Thanks to everyone who came down to see us at the recent gala event. It was great to spread the word about what we do as a cricket club, and specifically the junior programme, which continues to go from strength to strength – with dozens of children coming down to our Friday night training sessions to improve their skills, and three different age groups teams now having regular games.

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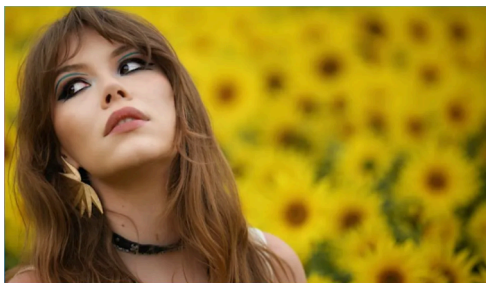

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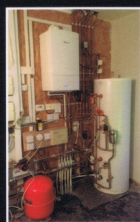
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
